## ATTORNEY GENERAL OPINION 2017-765A

Dear Executive Director Marks:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the Board of Licensed Social Workers intends to take pursuant to consent decree with respect to Complaints 2016-26 and 2016-27. The complaints allege that the licensee, a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, acted unprofessionally and was negligent with regard to signs of alleged physical abuse of a juvenile client. The Board proposes to require additional training, supervision by a Board-approved supervisor, and a written report detailing corrective actions taken.

The Social Worker's Licensing Act provides that "the [Board is] responsible for the control and regulation of the practice of social work in this state" including licensing and "[t]he establishment and enforcement of compliance with professional standards of practice and rules of conduct of social workers [.]" 59 O.S.2011, § 1256.1(A)(1)-(3). The Board may discipline licensees who engage in "[u]nprofessional conduct as determined by the Board." 59 O.S.Supp.2016, § 1266.1(A)(1). The Board's rules also authorize the Board to discipline licensees that are "guilty of negligence or wrongful actions in the performance of . . . duties as a social worker." OAC 675:3-1-4(a)(5). By rule, the Board may enter into a "Consent Decree . . . agreed to by the Board and the licensee," *see* OAC 675:3-1-3(c)(4), which "may include, but is not limited to . . . a letter of education instructing the licensee to correct the aspect of practice in question . . . [and] a tutorial assigned to the licensee to remedy the practice in question, under the supervision of a Board Approved Supervisor[.]" OAC 675:3-1-3(c)(2)(D)(i), (ii). The Board may reasonably believe that its proposed action is necessary to uphold the professional standards of clinical social workers.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the Board of Licensed Social Workers has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to safeguard the welfare of the people of the State of Oklahoma.
