Dear Executive Director Church:

This office has received your request for a written Attorney General Opinion regarding action that the State Board of Pharmacy intends to take with registrant T-14968. The Board found that the registrant stole 200 Oxycodone tablets from an employer and tested positive for several Controlled Dangerous Substances for which the registrant did not have prescriptions. The Board proposes to revoke the registrant's pharmacy technician permit.

O.S.Supp.2017, § 353.7. Specifically, "[t]he State Board of Pharmacy may . . . [r]evoke permanently or suspend any certificate, license or permit issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act or reprimand or place on probation any holder of a certificate, license, or permit who . . . violates any provision of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act" or "conducts himself or herself in a manner likely to lower public esteem for the profession of pharmacy." *Id.* § 353.26(A)(1)(b), (e). The Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act states that "[i]t shall be unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally to possess a controlled dangerous substance unless such substance was obtained directly, or pursuant to a valid prescription or order from a practitioner, while acting in the course of his or her professional practice, or except as otherwise authorized by this act." 63 O.S.Supp.2017, § 2-402(A)(1). The Board may reasonably believe the proposed action is necessary to deter future violations.

It is, therefore, the official opinion of the Attorney General that the State Board of Pharmacy has adequate support for the conclusion that this action advances the State's policy to protect public health, safety, and welfare.

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
